Thank you to everyone for your patience with the new roll out of the school meal ordering system, it seems to running really well. The children seem to be enjoying selecting their names when they come in for their dinners.

Just a few reminders -

• Orders need to be placed before Tuesday 12.00 midnight for the following week. Any orders not received before that time will mean that the children will be given the default meal of jacket potato and a filling each day

- Please note orders for after the half term holiday MUST be placed by TUESDAY 18TH OCTOBER.
- You can also change your child's meals prior to the cut-off time of Tuesday 12.00 midnight

. Once your meals are in the basket, please make sure you process the basket and click the pay button (you are not paying for the meals, you are just checking them out)

• You can order your meals in advance as far as you like - the school menus run for 4 weeks and then repeat.

Please sit with your child to choose the menus as this helps them know what they are eating that week we have had some children not eat their dinners as they do not like the choice chosen for them or they weren't aware of what had been chosen for them.

We have contacted those parents whose children have not eaten the chosen meal each day this week, so that they can change the choice when that menu is next on. I can see from our system that quite a few parents have not ordered their meals for next week despite reminders from the school. We really want the children to be eating meals that yourselves and the children have chosen, so please make sure the meals are ordered for each week.

# Attendance – We're Here to Help!

Good attendance is not just valuable, it is essential! Going to school regularly is directly linked to better academic progress and performance. It is extremely important that your child attends regularly in every year group (not just Year 6) as children's brains make links to prior learning and any gaps can cause difficulties learning new concepts.

Not only is good attendance essential for academic success, but also for personal and social development. Breaks in attendance make it difficult for children to build and sustain friendships. If your child is regularly absent, other children will be less likely to form strong bonds as on days your child is absent, they would have no one to play with.

# Year 6

Year 6 completed an 'information station' lesson in the hall to learn all about daily life in Ancient Greek times. They visited the different stations and used a range of sources (illustrations, photographs of sculpture, books and a website) to find out as much as they could about what it was like to live in Ancient Greek times.



Year 4

Year 4 had a history visitor in school, who brought lots of props and items from the Anglo-Saxon times. They learned a lot about the Anglo-Saxons and had the opportunity to dress up as one. The props were passed around at the end for the children to take a closer look at, which they were thrilled about. There were swords, helmets, spears, shields, clothes and many more items. They also asked some really good questions at the end of the session.
