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
FROM ALL OF THE STAFF AND PUPILS AT HYLTON CASTLE PRIMARY SCHOOL

We have learned all about our chosen scientist, Sir Isaac Newton, and have been trying out a few experiments in class to demonstrate his findings on gravity and the 'Three Rules of Motion'. They are quite tricky to understand but we have had great fun trying! We have also been experimenting on gummy bears to see if putting them in water of different temperatures changes them in any way. We were amazed to discover that they grow even bigger in cold water!

Year 4 had a fantastic trip to Beamish to support and learn more about our History topic, 'The Victorians'. Children were able to see what life was like then and compare it to life now. They were able to watch a demonstration at the sweet shop (before some then bought their own). They visited the hairdressers, the bakery, the stables, the bank, the school and many more. They made some great comparisons and differences to the classrooms then and now. We were also accompanied by the snow, which the children were excited about.







Nursery

This week Nursery carried out an experiment for Science Week. We looked at how we could change the shape of different sweets, we chose jelly babies! We had two different types of jelly babies and we tried to squash them or stretch them to see which one worked best! When we squashed the jelly baby it went really small and when we stretch the jelly baby it's head or legs ended up falling off! At the end of the experiment we had a little treat and got to eat the jelly babies which was our favorite part!
