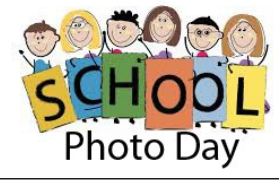


Class Photos - Tuesday 13th June

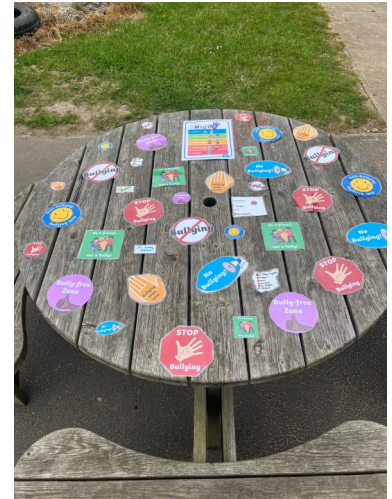
OPAL update

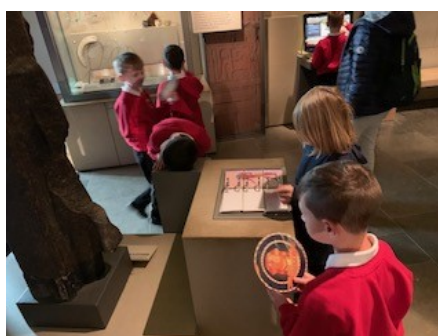
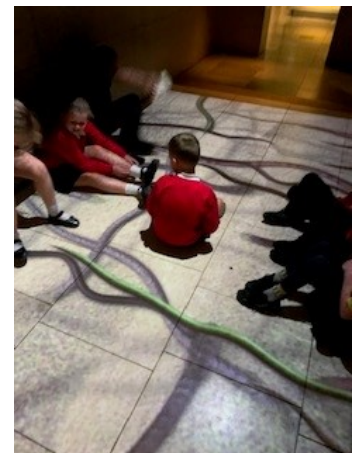
Anti Bullying

Half Term Fun

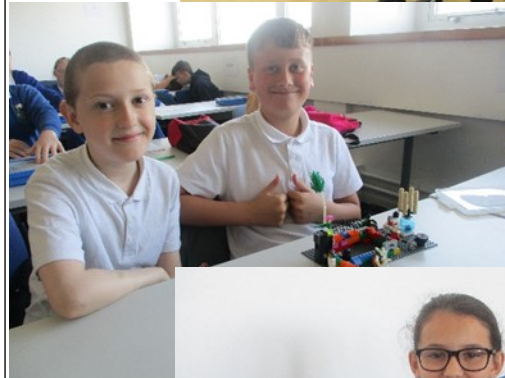
Active Future attended Hylton Castle Primary School over the half term and we were amazed by the creativity and enthusiasm of all of the children. A special mention goes out to Poppy Burnicle who had a fantastic attitude and was helpful with other children during the activities. At Active Future, we strive to make every person who attends our programmes, fall in love with movement. Whether it's an after school club, curriculum delivery or a specific project Active Future will work with schools and education departments to provide expert and fit for purpose schemes. This will be based upon the needs of the children and will be supported in evidence and inline with current guidelines.

With sport being the most common movement activity there is a high focus on sport within the Active Future programme. However, much of this will be free play and child directed. One of our most celebrated programmes are the Free Play activities where children get to choose exactly what their provision looks like. We engaged the children in Futsal, dodgeball, hide and seek (which went down a storm) den building, and so much more.
