- Go to www.coop.co.uk/membership and follow the instructions

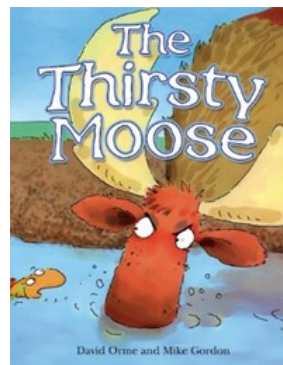
- Ask in store for a membership card and complete the form
